

A LETTER FROM OUR PRESIDENT

I hope this Annual Report conveys some of the spirit and excitement that one can feel just walking down the hallways at Holy Family Catholic School these days. It is quite the place. The School's rich diversity obviously distinguishes it from most other Iowa elementary schools today. Over 95% of the Holy Family students represent diverse racial and cultural backgrounds, with 15 languages spoken among them, and many students are first-generation Americans. The School's educational program reflects that diversity and includes 15 additional teaching days to help reduce learning loss and ease language barriers. Paulette's letter (page 4) describes life in the building better than I can, so I will leave that to her. But I will say this: the School and its dedicated teachers and staff show us all what it means to be "welcoming the stranger."



The Foundation's mission has always been to help ensure that the School had sufficient resources to provide its students with an exemplary, faith-based education. The needs today are similar in many respects to what they were 30+ years ago, and no less significant. The math is pretty simple: the costs to operate the School far exceed what can be raised from tuition, the supporting parishes (3 parishes at first, now 5), and other available sources. The new State-funded "education savings accounts" are a great help for the parents of Holy Family students, because those accounts can be used to pay the School's tuition. But tuition alone doesn't come close to covering the full cost of operating the School (you can see the expected sources of funding for fiscal 2024/25 illustrated on page 5.) And besides the operating support, the Foundation is the primary source for funding the capital expenditures required to maintain or improve the buildings and grounds and enhance the School's educational programs. By necessity, and with the help of many generous donors over 30 years, the Foundation has become the School's backstop, its reserve fund, and its critical partner.

The Foundation Board believes firmly that the education the students receive at Holy Family, and the values and faith they take with them when they graduate, make a huge difference for them, their families, and the communities they will live in. Donations to the Foundation make that happen, and it is life-changing. That's why we do this, and that's why your support is so important.

This Annual Report lists those who made contributions to the Foundation during this past fiscal year, which ended June 30, 2024. Whether you attended our annual golf outing or the Barn Bash, or contributed during our Annual Appeal or Adopt-a-Student campaign, or simply mailed in a check, thank you one and all. Whatever the amount, your contributions make a difference to the Holy Family students and the education they receive.

On behalf of those students, and their families, thank you again for your continued support of Holy Family Catholic School.



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SPOTLIGHT ON SUCCESS

Holy Family Band Program

Participation in the band program at Holy Family is open to all students in grades 5-8. Band is recognized nationally as a worthwhile educational activity because of its positive impact on the development of reading, math, motor, physical, social, communication, analytical, and critical thinking skills. Students who play in band at Holy Family can go on to play in concert bands and marching bands at the high school and college level. As students get older, band is an excellent extra-curricular and social activity that can continue throughout their lives.

At Holy Family, musical skills are nurtured and developed through a well-planned music curriculum designed to teach each student to learn, understand and perform the basic elements of music: melody, pitch, harmony, rhythm, form and note reading. This is accomplished through weekly music classes, starting at the Pre-K level. In 4th Grade, every student receives their own recorder (flute) that they are allowed to keep. Playing recorder is a good introduction to learning other instruments. Beginning in 5th Grade, students can receive weekly band lessons at school. They perform individually, in an ensemble, in our band, and with students from other Des Moines Catholic schools in combined concerts and activities.





8th Grade Manners Class

On May 10th, 2024, the 8th Graders experienced firsthand the importance of good manners! Each year, a few classes are dedicated to covering the basics of dining etiquette and what that entails. Students learn about table settings, decorum, proper attire, and other character building attributes so that they feel confident in formal settings. As a reward for all their work, our classy group dressed in their best and enjoyed a formal lunch at the Des Moines Embassy Club.

HFCS Student receives Presidential Scholarship

Congratulations to Holy Family graduate, Anderson Vi, who was recently presented with the Presidential Scholar's Award from Dowling Catholic High School. This award is based on a combination of test scores, grades, essays and teacher recommendations.

Having attending Holy Family since Kindergarten, Anderson admits he will miss the people and the daily routine, but he is looking forward to starting his journey at Dowling Catholic High School this fall. Anderson's mother, Kim Vi, spoke about how Holy Family has shaped her son. "Holy Family has offered my family personalized attention that Anderson wouldn't have received in public school. The discipline and integration of religious education with academics, starting from the pre-k program, have been pivotal. The school has been preparing Anderson for high school since the sixth grade, and although his next step is undecided, he is ready."



Anderson stays busy with a variety of interests including a passion for math, science, and music and can often be found playing piano and saxophone in his free time. "It's a soothing way to to distract myself" he says. Despite his focus on academics and music, Anderson's outstanding athletic skill led him to being selected to join the Iowa Junior All-Stars baseball team for the Midwest regional tournament in 2023.

When asked what motivates him to work so hard, he says, "I've seen the dedication and hard work my parents consistently put into our family. They have instilled in me the values of education, diligence and perseverance. Their love and support mean a great deal to me". Although raised here in Iowa, Anderson's family roots reach back to Vietnam where some of his mother's family still resides. "I would love the opportunity to visit Vietnam again" he says, "...the people are incredibly hospitable, and the cuisine is amazing. Vietnam is the home of numerous natural wonders and diverse areas to discover and study."



For the time being, Anderson's focus will be on the future. "I look forward to meeting new people and making new friends. High school represents a new chapter in my life and promises to be one of the most memorable experiences." A chapter that will most certainly pave the way for even more future success. 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SCHOOL UPDATES

HFCS Playground Upgrades Completed





The School celebrated the recent completion of the playground upgrades and new greenhouse which culminated on August 13th with an official ribbon cutting and blessing from the Most Reverend Bishop Joensen. The area adjacent to the school features a new play structure, including a rubberized play surface and a gaga pit (enclosed area for soccer and similar games). "Not only is the area nicer to look at, it's safer for our kids" says Paulette Theisen, HFCS Principal. "We are grateful for the support we received that allowed us to complete this project in time for the students to use it this year." The new greenhouse will be used to help introduce a 'Farm to Table' curriculum for middle school students along with additional science based projects.



Athletics Program Updates



HFCS Alumni and ISU Rugby coach, Anthony Frein has been a dedicated force in helping to increase extra curricular activities for Holy Family's students. Goals for this school year will include getting new uniforms for volleyball, basketball and track as well as adding the option of City League Basketball for 3rd and 4th grades, so that all students from grades 3-8 have the ability to play an organized sport through Holy Family. Also added this year will be City League Soccer for boys in 6/7th grade, thus adding a third sport for male students to mirror the offering on the girls' side. "Adding other clubs that interest the students including tutoring, is something we're working towards", said Frein. "These programs work to foster deeper connections and pride within our students and allows them build confidence in themselves" he added.

Qualified Charitable Distributions-Those age 70-1/2 or older can transfer up to \$100,000 (adjusted annually by IRS) from your IRA accounts each year directly to the Foundation and other charities. The transfers count towards any "required minimum distribution" and you do not recognize taxable income on the transfer.
